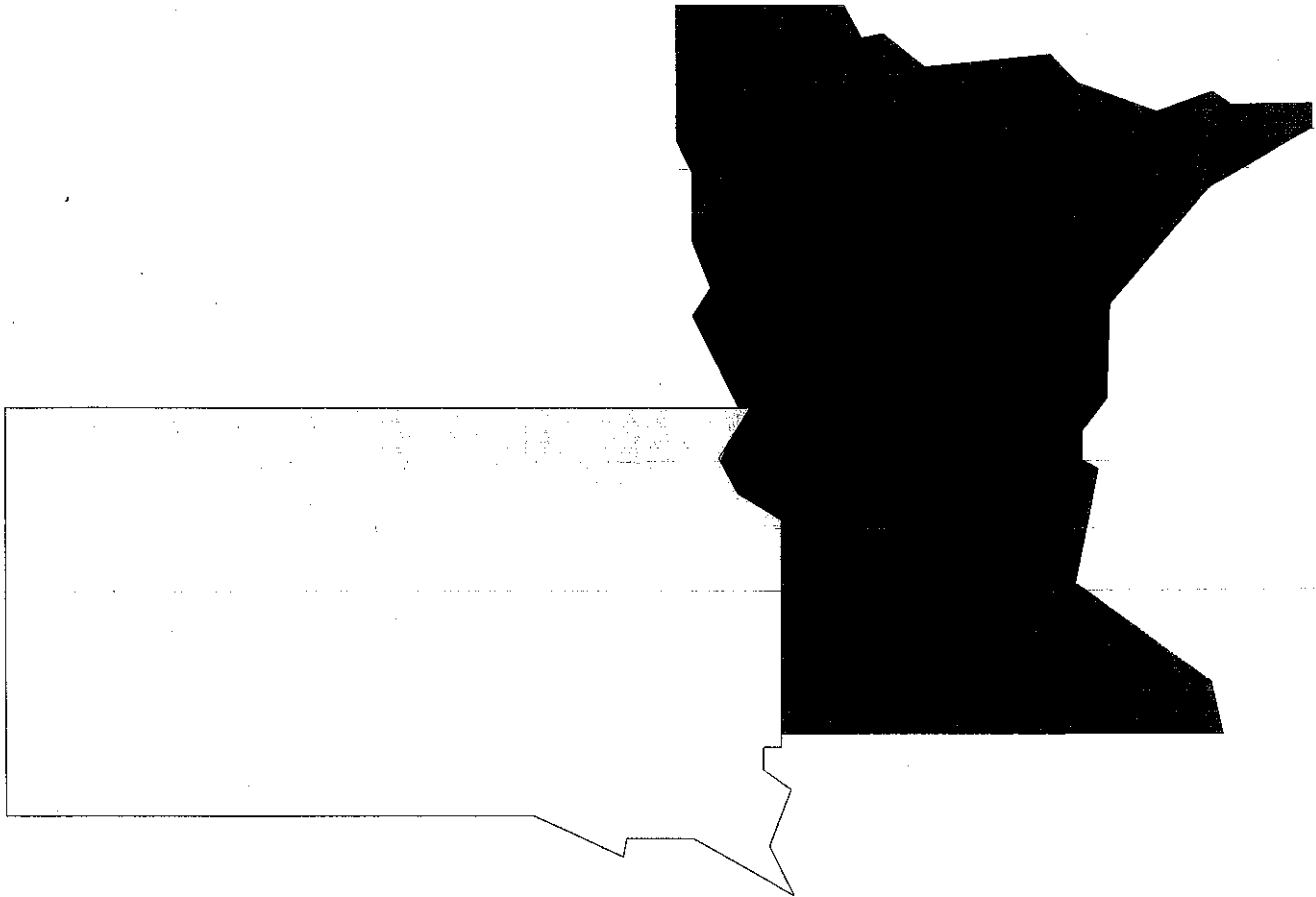

Questions and Answers about Tuition Reciprocity with Minnesota

1. Who is eligible for the benefits of the Minnesota – South Dakota Tuition Reciprocity Program?

Residents of South Dakota are eligible for reciprocity status to attend public colleges and universities in Minnesota. Residents of Minnesota are eligible for reciprocity status to attend the South Dakota state universities. **Residents of South Dakota only need to apply for reciprocity if they are going to attend one of the University of Minnesota schools.** The other schools will automatically give the student the rate.

2. What tuition rates do South Dakota residents who are approved for reciprocity status pay when they attend college in Minnesota?

<i>Minnesota College/University</i>	<i>South Dakota Resident Pays</i>
Any University of Minnesota campus	MN resident tuition rate
State universities	MN resident tuition rate
Technical colleges	MN resident tuition rate
Community colleges	Slightly more than MN resident tuition rate

3. When should I apply for reciprocity and what is the deadline for turning in reciprocity forms?

If you send your application to the Reciprocity Office **two months** before the semester begins, you are likely to be billed at the reciprocity tuition rate (assuming you are approved).

The deadline for applying is the last day of the term or semester the student is attending. For example, a student who is attending college in the fall semester has until the last day of the semester to apply for reciprocity. This is NOT recommended. Failure to apply before the term begins makes it likely that you will be billed at the much higher non-resident rate.

Reciprocity status is **not retroactive**. You may apply for reciprocity status for future or current semesters, not for past semesters.
